How to read this data.

- There are 79 candidates for the NSW senate election. 75 of these are in the 25 groups/parties (Group A to Y). Plus there are 4 ungrouped candidates not shown.
- Each Party's preferences are detailed in their Group Voting Ticket - which has been lodged with the Australian Electoral Commission.
NB. The voter can not allocate preferences if they vote above the line on the Ballot Paper - which 98% of NSW voters did in the 2004 Federal Election.
- Each party's first three preferences, after themselves, are shown in the yellow headed columns. For example, the Liberal/Nationals (Group A), have the CDP as their 1st preference, then the FFP as their 2nd preference, and then the CA as their 3rd.
- The SEP & CA parties have lodged multiple Group Voting Tickets, so their preferences are split three and two ways respectively.
- The orange headed columns show where the Greens, Labor and Liberal/Nationals receive the party's preference.
For example, the Citizens Electoral Council have the Greens at 74, the Labor at 56 and Liberal/Nationals candidate at 3.
This shows that the Citizens Electoral Council's preferences flow to the Lib/Nats before Labor and The Greens.
- The parties highlighted in blue are giving their preferences to the Liberal/Nationals before both Labor and The Greens.**
